

Dear Messrs. Johnson and Smith:

Thank you for your letter dated July 12, 2016, in which you requested to interview a number of current and former Platte River Networks ("PRN") personnel.

As you know, the confidential information PRN voluntarily provided to the Committee in 2015 was leaked and publicized selectively, unfairly, and for what appears to be political partisan advantage. This directly led to additional and unwarranted hardship on my client, PRN, which is the premier IT company in Colorado. At great expense to PRN, the FBI has already extensively investigated and interviewed the relevant parties. PRN was only involved with presidential candidate Clinton after she had left her position as Secretary of State, which is beyond the scope of your inquiry. Accordingly, I respectfully decline your requests.
